## Lodging Information

Telephones, Televisions, Radios & Alarm Clocks:

There are no telephones, televisions or radios in guest accommodations to interfere with your relaxing Ranch experience. A courtesy phone is located in the main lobby for your convenience.

Cell service is available through some carriers on the Ranch. To preserve the Ranch's historic "unplugged" character, we ask you to please mute your cell phones in common use areas – the porch, lobby, dining room, pool and shared accommodations. Private conversations will be appreciated by all.

Fireplaces:

If you are staying in one of our cabins, fire starters, matches, and fire-starting instructions are on your cabin's mantel. Extra wood is stacked on the side of your cabin. Starting with two logs pushed toward the back of the fireplace is recommended, as to not cause too much smoke.

Swimming Pool:

Our natural hot springs swimming pool is located on the lower ranch across the highway from the Lodge. The temperature may range from 98° to 104° (F). Pool towels are available at the pool located in the storage bins. Plush robes are provided in your cabins, and you're encouraged to use them during your time at the hot springs. Changing rooms are located in The Shed.

**The pool will be closed for cleaning Tuesday morning, and will reopen in late afternoon.**

The Salmon River, our pond, Gold Creek and other small streams are on the Ranch property. Please exercise caution near these bodies of water and supervise children at all times.

The Shed:

Our multi-functional recreation room, adjacent to the hot springs pool on the lower ranch, is open for scheduled massages and relaxation on the patio by the gas-lit fire pits. In addition, shuffleboard, ping

**Housekeeping:**

The Ranch is a unique, historic facility in a peaceful setting. Our Lodge and Cabins are not as soundproof as modern structures; therefore, we ask you to observe our quiet time after 10:30pm.

**Smoking:**

The Idaho Rocky Mountain Ranch is a clean air establishment. Thank you for not smoking inside any of the buildings. Smoking, with courtesy to non-smokers, is permitted more than 15 feet away from any structure. Consideration given to the historical significance of our Ranch and surrounding forest is greatly appreciated.

**Pets:**

Pets are not permitted on the Ranch property.

**Gratuity:**

The staff at the Idaho Rocky Mountain Ranch works as a team with a strong commitment to providing friendly and efficient service. The Ranch welcomes guests to use their discretion recognizing the personal attention and service received from our staff, and any gratuity you choose to leave should be added to your final invoice. These gestures are greatly appreciated and shared among every seasonal staff member based on the hours they worked while you were staying with us.

**Activities:**

On the Ranch and in the area, hiking, horseback riding, mountain biking, fishing, rafting and rock climbing are available for all ability levels. We'll help you arrange the experience you seek and ensure it's memorable whether you're a beginning explorer or skilled adventurer.

**On-Ranch Activities:**

- Horseback Riding: Wild West Horse Adventures

Wild West Horse Adventures will take you on a variety of trails in and around the Ranch to experience breathtaking vistas, scenic waterways, wildflowers, and wildlife. All horseback trails are scenic walking rides, and suitable for ages 6 and up. Wild West Horse Adventures operates out of our lower ranch corrals, and is a short drive down the driveway from our cabins and main lodge.

Horseback rides are offered **Monday through Saturday** at the per-rider rate:

- **Cowhand Ride** - One Hour - \$100 + tax/person
- **Salmon River Ride** - One and a half hour forest ride with river crossing - \$125 + tax/person
- **Prospector Ride** - Two hours. Private forest ride with creek crossings - \$150 + tax/person
- **Ridgetop Ride** - Three Hours - \$200 + tax/person
- **Loping Ride** - Two Hours - Advanced - \$250 + tax/person
- **Round Pen Lesson** - 30 minutes and up - Starting at \$75 + tax/person

- **Fishing:** Our stocked catch-and-release fishing pond and the Salmon River are available for fishing. We have fly fishing rods available for guest use. Life vests are required and are available at the pond. A license is not needed for our pond. A license is required for anyone 14 years and older to fish the Salmon River even on Ranch property.
- **Mountain Biking:** Bikes, helmets, and maps are available for guests to use. Please come to the office for equipment and information. You'll need to sign the waiver at the end of this document, or at the front desk, prior to borrowing IRMR mountain bikes.
- **Massages:** A certified massage therapist is available for a relaxing massage after your activities or just to help you wind down to Idaho time. See our office staff to schedule appointments or for additional info.
- **Additional Activities:** stand-up paddleboarding, walking/hiking trails, horseshoes, bocce, frisbee golf, other indoor/outdoor games, the hot springs pool, and more!

#### Off-Ranch Activities:

- **Guided Fly Fishing:** Contact Jack Banse - our resident fishing guide with Silver Creek Outfitters - at 508-612-8623 to schedule your guided fly fishing trip in the Sawtooth Valley. From novice to expert, Jack will tailor your experience to you. Please let Jack know that you are a guest at the Ranch.
  - **3/4 Day Fishing:** Usually 4-6 hours. \$525 per day for 1 - 2 anglers.
  - **Full-Day Fishing:** Covers all of Silver Creek's licensed areas. \$695 per day for 1 - 2 anglers.
  - **Drift Boat Fishing:** Over 60-plus miles of water along the Salmon River. Full Day Trips (8+ hours), \$895 for 1 - 2 anglers.

Once booked, Jack will meet you at the main lobby at the lodge on the morning of your trip.

#### Day Hikes in the Sawtooth National Recreation Area:

1. **TITUS LAKE:** Access is at Galena Summit / Easy / 3 miles RT; 500 ft elevation gain
2. **ALPINE CREEK MEADOWS:** Access is at the end of Alturas Lake Rd. – Alpine Cr. Trailhead / Easy / 6.2 miles RT; 550 ft elevation gain

3. CABIN CREEK LAKES: Access is by Cabin Creek Rd (one mile north of Alturas Lake and Cabin Creek Rd junction) / Difficult / 7.6 miles RT; 2,000 ft elevation gain
4. TIN CUP TRAILHEAD HIKES: Access is via Pettit Lake Rd, two miles of dirt road.
  - Alice Lake: Difficult / 11.4 miles RT; 1,600 ft elevation gain
  - Toxaway Lake: Difficult / 14.6 miles RT; 2,100 ft elevation gain
  - Yellow Belly Lake: Moderate / 4.8 miles RT; 1,000 ft elevation gain
  - Farley Lake: Difficult / 9.4 miles RT; 1,100 ft elevation gain and 380 ft loss
5. HELL ROARING LAKE: Access via Decker Flat Road. / Moderate / 10 miles RT; 600 ft elevation gain
6. REDFISH LAKE TRAILHEAD HIKES: Access is from Redfish Lake Trailhead.
  - Fishhook Creek Trail: Easy / 5.8 miles RT; 300 ft. elevation gain
  - Bench Lakes: Moderate / 8 miles RT; 1,225 ft elevation gain. Access from Fishhook Creek trail.
  - Marshall Lake: Difficult / 9.6 miles RT; 1,850 ft elevation gain. Access from Fishhook Creek trail
7. REDFISH LAKE INLET HIKES: Access is from Inlet Trailhead at the south end of Redfish Lake. Redfish Lake Lodge operates a shuttle boat to and from the south end of the lake.
  - Lily Pond & Redfish Lake Creek Falls: Easy / 2.8 miles RT; 250 ft elevation gain
  - Alpine Lake: Difficult / 11 miles RT; 1,800 ft elevation gain
  - Cramer Lakes: Difficult / 14 miles RT; 1,800 ft elevation gain
  - Baron Divide: Difficult / 14.2 miles RT; 2,800 ft. elevation gain
8. IRON CREEK TRAILHEAD: Access is from Iron Creek Rd. It is 3 miles of dirt road to the trailhead.
  - Alpine & Sawtooth Lakes: Moderate / 8 miles RT to Alpine Lake, 10 miles RT to Sawtooth Lake. 1,000 ft elevation gain to Alpine Lake, extra 700 ft. to Sawtooth Lake
9. BRIDAL VEIL FALLS: Trail begins at Stanley Lake Trailhead near Stanley Lake Inlet Campground. Moderate / 7.9 miles RT; 350 ft. elevation gain
10. BOUNDARY CREEK / CASINO LAKES: Access by Boundary Creek Rd, opposite Sawtooth Fish Hatchery. Half mile on dirt road. Difficult / 10 miles roundtrip / 3,000 ft elev. gain to Boundary Creek summit and additional 600 ft loss to Casino Lakes
11. FOURTH OF JULY CREEK HIKES: Access is 10 miles of rough dirt road.
  - Fourth of July Lake: Moderate / 3.6 miles RT; 760 ft elevation gain
  - Washington Lake: Moderate / 6 miles RT; 1,000 ft elevation gain & 200 ft loss
  - Born Lakes: Difficult / 8.5 miles RT; 1,330 ft elevation gain
